RESOLVES, 1957

Chapter 48

RESOLVE, Opening Abbee Pond, Piscataquis County, to Ice Fishing.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves passed by the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the following legislation is necessary to permit ice fishing in Abbee pond during the winter of 1957; and

Whereas, such legislation is in the best interest of conserving our natural resources; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Opening Abbee pond; ice fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Abbee pond in Brownville, Piscataquis county, to ice fishing from ice in to March 31st.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 49

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Bemis Stream, Franklin County.

Bemis stream; regulating fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Bemis stream in Rangeley Plt., Twp. D, Franklin county, to fly fishing only from April 1st until September 14th, from red posts on Mooselucmeguntic lake to north side of railroad bridge at Summit, daily limit 5 fish. Tributaries closed.
