Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Conservation education for teachers. Resolved: That the Department of Inland Fisheries and Game be authorized to spend its funds to further training in conservation education for teachers and children up to \$5,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1958 and up to \$5,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1959. Such moneys may be expended for capital improvements on the property of Conservation Education Foundation.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 66

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Certain Waters in Piscataquis County.

Piscataquis county; regulating fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation prohibiting the use or possession of live fish as bait on the following waters in Piscataquis county and establishing daily bag limits to conform with the general laws of Piscataquis county:

Alligator pond, T. A., R. II

Bear pond, T. A., R. II

Crawford pond, T. A., R. II

Johnson pond, T. A., R. II

Pleasant pond, T. A., R. II

Pleasant pond, Little, T. A., R. II

Rocky pond, Big, T. A., R. II

Rubberneck pond, T. A., R. II; and be it further

Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening the

following waters in Piscataquis county to fly fishing only with a daily limit of 5 fish:

- Birch Ridge pond, T. A., R. II
- Boardman pond, Big, T. A., R. II
- Fox pond, T. A., R. II
- Mirror pond, T. A., R. II
- Yoke pond, T. A., R. II
- Boardman pond, Little, T. A., R. II
- Little Rocky pond, T. A., R. II.

Chapter 67

RESOLVE, Authorizing a Right of Way for a Pipeline over Land of State School for Boys.

State School for boys; authorizing a right of way for a pipeline over land. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Institutional Service, in the name of the State of Maine be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to convey by quitclaim deed to Portland Water District, its successors and assigns, the right perpetually to enter at any and all times upon a strip of land owned by the State of Maine and situated in the city of South Portland, in the county of Cumberland and State of Maine, said strip being shown on a plan entitled "Plan of Right of Way across land of State of Maine State School for Boys," dated December, 1956, said plan being now on file in the office of the Secretary of State, to which plan reference is hereby made for a more particular description of said strip, and to construct and perpetually maintain through and across said strip conduits or pipelines for conveying water and to lay, relay, repair, maintain and remove water pipe or pipes upon or under said strip with all necessary fixtures and appurtenances.

RESOLVE, Authorizing Arthur W. Bushey and Alice Bushey, both of Waterville, John Tibbetts, Archie Leeman and Oscar Bradstreet, all of Palermo, to Sue the State of Maine.

Certain persons authorized to sue State of Maine. Resolved: That Arthur W. Bushey and Alice Bushey, both of Waterville, John Tibbetts, Archie Leeman and Oscar Bradstreet, all of Palermo, who suffered flowage damage in 1949 to their lands adjacent to Sheepscot pond, due, as they claim, to the failure of the State to properly protect their property while building a dam for a rearing pool, be, and hereby are, authorized to bring a suit at law in the Superior Court
