CHAP. 84

Chapter 81

RESOLVE, Regulating Taking of Smelts in Valley Brook, Cumberland County.

Taking of smelts in Valley brook; regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to close Valley Brook, in the town of Raymond, county of Cumberland, a tributary of Little Rattlesnake pond, now known as Raymond Lake, to the taking of smelts at any time.

Effective August 28, 1957

Chapter 82

RESOLVE, in Favor of George E. Bagnall of Houlton.

George E. Bagnall; credits toward retirement allowance. Resolved: That in arriving at the service retirement allowance payable to George E. Bagnall, of Houlton, as the beneficiary nominated by Isaac Bagnall, deceased member of the State Retirement System, credit be given for such period of time as the late Isaac Bagnall was in the employ of the Maine National Guard pursuant to section 90 of the Defense Act of 1916.

Chapter 83

RESOLVE, Designating New Bridge to Span Jonesport Reach from the Town of Jonesport to the Town of Beals as "Jonesport-Beals Bridge."

"Jonesport-Beals Bridge;" designated. Resolved: That the new bridge being constructed across Jonesport Reach from the town of Jonesport to the town of Beals, in the county of Washington, under the provisions of chapter 198 of the private and special laws of 1955, be officially named and referred to as "Jonesport-Beals Bridge."

Chapter 84

RESOLVE, Regulating the Taking of Clams in Steuben.

Taking of clams in Steuben, regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Sea and Shore Fisheries be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue the following rule and regulation:

That it shall be unlawful for any person not a resident of the town of Steuben, in the county of Washington, to dig clams for commercial purposes within the limits of said town;
