economic aspects of a proposed bridge to Chebeague Island. Without intent to limit the scope of the study, the commission shall review such facts and conclusions as have been presented in the so-called Fay, Spofford, Thorndike report on this subject, which report was presented at the regular session of the 98th Legislature. They shall particularly concern themselves with any corrections they deem necessary in bringing up to current construction costs the cost estimates presented in the aforesaid report; similarly they shall bring up to date such interest costs as were used in arriving at certain basic conclusions in that report. The results of their study shall be reported to the next regular session of the Legislature along with such conclusions as the facts so developed may indicate to the end that the 99th Legislature may be reasonably informed on the question of whether or not a toll facility, so established, may be expected to be self-liquidating. If the study concludes the facility will not be self-liquidating, the report shall indicate reasonable estimates of year by year subsidy required to operate and maintain the facility and to service such long term debt as may be required.

The study shall include the economic effect of the proposed bridge on the other islands in Casco Bay adjacent to Chebeague Island.

Chapter 179

RESOLVE, Authorizing Commissioner of Institutional Service to Grant Certain Easements on Land of the State Hospital in Bangor.

Commissioner of Institutional Service authorized to grant certain easements. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Institutional Service, with the approval of the Governor and Council, be, and is, authorized to grant to the Bangor Water District such easements as may be mutually agreed upon, on terms that may be mutually agreed upon, covering the location of underground pipelines and mains for the purpose of conveying water across, through and under certain land of the Bangor State Hospital in Bangor, together with the right to construct, maintain and use an access road or way within the area subject to the exercise of said easements.
