Chapter 1

AN ACT Permitting Prisoners at County Jails to Attend Funerals Outside.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 89, § 189-A, additional. Chapter 89 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section to be numbered 189-A, to read as follows:

‘Sec. 189-A. Prisoners to attend funerals. Prisoners at the several county jails may, at the discretion of the sheriff, attend funerals of their legally considered mother, father, husband, wife, son or daughter, if the funeral is held within the State of Maine. Prisoners shall pay the cost of transportation and the fee and expenses of the officer who takes them to the funeral.’
