Chapter 25

AN ACT Relating to Use of Lights on School Buses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 48, amended. The 6th paragraph of section 48 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes is amended by inserting before the last sentence a new sentence to read as follows:

'Flashing lights on school buses shall be turned on by the operator of such bus at least 100 feet before any stop is made to receive or discharge its passengers and shall be continually displayed until after the bus has received or discharged its passengers.'

Chapter 26

AN ACT Permitting Savings Banks to Make Loans to Certain Students.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 59, § 19-H, sub-§ III, ¶ A, sub-¶ 3, division d, additional. Subparagraph 3 of paragraph A of subsection III of section 19-H of chapter 59 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 380 of the public laws of 1955, is amended by adding a new division, to be lettered d, to read as follows:

'd. To an amount within the discretion of the trustees, providing the loan is made to assist the borrower to further his higher education and is guaranteed in full or in part by the New England Higher Education Assistance Foundation.'

Chapter 27

AN ACT Relating to Terms of the Superior Court in York County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 106, § 11, sub-§ XVI, amended. Subsection XVI of section 11 of chapter 106 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 1 of chapter 220 of the public laws of 1955, is further amended to read as follows:

'XVI. York: At Alfred on the first Tuesdays of January, May, September and November, but the criminal business of said county shall be transacted at the terms held on the first Tuesdays of January, May and September, together with civil business.'
