Chapter 46

AN ACT Relating to Payments to Lincoln County Law Library.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 89, § 135, amended. That part of section 135 of chapter 89 of the Revised Statutes which relates to Lincoln County law library is amended to read as follows:

'Lincoln, ~~\$7,000~~ \$5,000 for the year 1959, \$5,000 for the year 1960 and \$2,000 annually thereafter.'

Sec. 2. Effective date. The provisions of this act shall be retroactive to January 1, 1959.

Chapter 47

AN ACT Providing for Limited Electrician's Licenses for Specific Installations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 82, § 2, sub-§ VI, amended. Subsection VI of section 2 of chapter 82 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 413 of the public laws of 1955, is amended to read as follows:

'VI. A limited electrician's license to install and service the electrical work related to a specific type of electrically operated equipment or to specific electrical installations shall be granted to any person who has passed a satisfactory examination before the State board of Examiners of Electricians. It shall specify the name of such person who shall be limited to engage in the occupation of installing and servicing the electrical work related to the type of equipment or to the specific electrical installations only authorized by this license.'

Chapter 48

AN ACT Relating to Personnel of State Civil Defense and Public Safety Agency.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, in order for the State Civil Defense and Public Safety Agency to be eligible for federal assistance under Public Law 85-606, it is necessary to have all positions, other than the director, under the personnel system; and
