Sec. 66. P. & S. L., 1959, c. 155, § 56-A, additional. Chapter 155 of the private and special laws of 1959 is amended by adding a new section 56-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 56-A. Use of draggers in part of Penobscot Bay. It shall be unlawful, from the first day of October to the first day of the following February, to use a dragger or any other dragging apparatus, except standard scallop drags, for the taking of fish or lobsters on the ocean bottom in that part of Penobscot Bay inside a line drawn from Southern Island to south end of Clark Island, to White Head Island, to Two Bush Island, to Metinic Island Ledge Buoy, to Duck Rock Buoy west of Monhegan Island, to Old Man Ledge Buoy, to Burnt Island, to West side of Mosquito Island, thence back to point of beginning.' (P. L., 1959, c. 345)

Sec. 67. P. & S. L., 1959, c. 155, § 73-A, additional. Chapter 155 of the private and special laws of 1959 is amended by adding a new section 73-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 73-A. Use of draggers in parts of Sheepscot Bay. It shall be unlawful, between the first day of November and the first day of the following March, to use a dragger or any other dragging apparatus, except standard scallop drags, for the taking of fish or lobsters on the ocean bottom of those parts of Sheepscot Bay, Sagadahoc and Lincoln Counties, inshore from a line drawn from the southern end of Cape Small Point to the southern end of Seguin Island; thence to southern end of Pumpkin Island; thence to Ocean Point.' (P. L., 1959, c. 344)

Sec. 68. P. L., 1959, c. 344, repealed; limitation. Chapter 344 of the public laws of 1959, heretofore passed by this Legislature, adding a new section 27-C to chapter 38 of the Revised Statutes, is hereby repealed and shall not be printed as part of the session laws of 1959.

Sec. 69. P. L., 1959, c. 345, repealed; limitation. Chapter 345 of the public laws of 1959, heretofore passed by this Legislature, adding a new section 27-B to chapter 38 of the Revised Statutes, is hereby repealed and shall not be printed as part of the session laws of 1959.

Chapter 364

AN ACT Relating to Clerical Assistance for Justices of the Superior Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 106, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 106 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 2 of chapter 472 of the public laws of 1955 and by section 2 of chapter 417 of the public laws of 1957, is further amended to read as follows:

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'Sec. 2. Salary; expenses. Each of the Justices of the Superior Court shall receive an annual salary of \$12,500. All provisions of section 4 of chapter 103 Chapter 103, section 4, relating to reimbursement of Justices of the Supreme Judicial Court for expenses incurred by them shall apply to Justices of the Superior Court, except that justices of the superior court shall not be entitled to including reimbursement for expenses incurred in employing clerical assistance but which in the aggregate shall not exceed a total sum of \$4,000 per year for all such clerical assistance.'

AN ACT Relating to Residence Requirements in Public Assistance.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 25, § 283, sub-§ III, amended. Subsection III of section 283 of chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'III. Has resided in the State for 5 or more years within the 9 years immediately preceding application for assistance and has resided therein continuously for one year immediately preceding the application;'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 25, § 299, sub-§ III, amended. Subsection III of section 299 of chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'III. Has resided in the State for $\frac{1}{2}$ or more years within the 9 years immediately preceding application for aid and has resided therein continuously for one year immediately preceding the application;'

Sec. 3. R. S., c. 25, § 319-F, sub-§ III, amended. Subsection III of section 319-F of chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 30 of chapter 405 of the public laws of 1955, is amended to read as follows:

'III. Has resided in the State for 5 or more years within the 9 years, immediately preceding application for aid and has resided therein continuously for one year immediately preceding the application;'
