CHAP. 5

PRIVATE AND SPECIAL, 1959

ed. Section 5th of the Act of Incorporation of the Trustees of Monmouth Academy, enacted by the General Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts on the 22nd day of February, 1803, said Act being amended by the said General Court on June 19, 1809, is further amended to read as follows:

'Section 5th. Be it further enacted, that the number of said trustees shall not at any one time be more than 11, or less than 7, 5 of whom shall constitute a quorum to do business ~~and that a majority of said Trustees shall consist of men who are not inhabitants of said Monmouth.~~

Chapter 4

AN ACT Relating to Pilots for the Port of Portland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1917, c. 192, § 10, amended. The last paragraph of section 10 of chapter 192 of the private and special laws of 1917, as repealed and replaced by chapter 24 of the private and special laws of 1927, is amended to read as follows:

'Said branch may be revoked at any time by said board, for negligence, incapacity or for any other reason that said board may deem sufficient. The branch, so granted, shall be recorded by the secretary or clerk of said board in a book kept for that purpose, entitled "Pilots for the Port of Portland"; and the ~~clerk~~ board shall receive from the applicant, for making such record, the sum of ~~five dollars~~ \$25.'

Chapter 5

AN ACT Relating to Qualifications for Appointment to Auburn Police and Fire Departments.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1917, c. 201, Art. VI, § 3, sub-§ (5), amended. Subsection (5) of section 3 of Article VI of chapter 201 of the private and special laws of 1917, as repealed and replaced by section 10 of chapter 47 of the private and special laws of 1943, is amended to read as follows:

'(5) Applicants for appointment to the fire department shall be not less than 5 feet ~~5 1/2~~ 8 inches in height and weigh not less than ~~130~~ 140 pounds and shall be not less than 21 years of age or not over 34 years of age. Applicants for appointment to the call force shall be not less than 21 years of age and not more than 40 years of age.

Applicants for appointment in the fire department who have been serving as call men for not less than 2 years prior to their application may be appointed to the permanent force of the fire department if not over 36 years of age.

Applicants for appointment to the police department shall be not less than 5 feet 8 inches in height and weigh not less than 140 pounds and shall be not less than 21 years of age and not over ~~30~~ 34 years of age.'

Chapter 6

AN ACT Changing Name of the Young Men's Christian Association of Auburn to The Young Men's Christian Association of Auburn-Lewiston.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1868, c. 519, § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 519 of the private and special laws of 1868 is amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 1. Corporators; name and purpose; capital and powers. R. W. Hanscom, Frank L. Dingley, John F. Cobb and Thomas A. D. Fessenden, their associates and successors, are hereby created a body politic and corporate, by the name of ~~the~~ The Young Men's Christian Association of ~~Auburn~~ Auburn-Lewiston, with power to take and hold, for religious, educational and charitable purposes, property, real and personal, to the amount of \$50,000, and may sell and convey the same; and said corporation shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties and liabilities, of similar corporations in this State.'

Chapter 7

AN ACT Relating to Value of Property Held by Portland Yacht Club.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1878, c. 69, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 69 of the private and special laws of 1878 is amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 2. May hold real and personal estate; amount. Said corporation may hold real estate to an amount not exceeding in value ~~twenty five thousand dollars~~ \$100,000, and personal estate to an amount not exceeding ~~twenty five thousand dollars~~ \$100,000.'

Chapter 8

AN ACT Relating to Residence of Chief of Police of Ogunquit Village Corporation.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment; and
