Chapter 35

AN ACT Permitting Pushaw Boat Club, Inc. to Erect Dam Across Pushaw Stream.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Dam across Pushaw Stream. Pushaw Boat Club, Inc., a corporation duly created by law and located at Old Town, County of Penobscot and State of Maine, the owner of land at the mouth of Pushaw Stream in Hudson, Penobscot County, is authorized to erect and maintain a dam across said Pushaw Stream, at or near the mouth of said stream.

Chapter 36

AN ACT to Authorize the Municipalities of Deer Isle and Stonington to Form a School Administrative District.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the school committees of the municipalities of Deer Isle and Stonington have filed applications with the Maine School District Commission for the formation of a School Administrative District; and

Whereas, the municipalities have conducted a thorough study of the school conditions in the area; and

Whereas, there is a vital need for safe and adequate school facilities in the municipalities; and

Whereas, the school programs of the area could be improved and more efficiently and economically operated; and

Whereas, it is geographically impossible to meet the minimum requirement of 300 resident high school pupils in this area; and

Whereas, the Maine School District Commission cannot approve the formation of this proposed district under the criteria set out in the Revised Statutes of 1954, chapter 41, section 111-E; and

Whereas, section III-D provides that the Legislature may establish such School Administrative Districts; and

Whereas, the Maine School District Commission recommends that the municipalities of Deer Isle and Stonington be authorized to establish a School Administrative District; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following
