Chapter 76

AN ACT Authorizing Forest Commissioner to Convey Interest of the State in Chase Island.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Interest of State in Chase Island, conveyed. The Forest Commissioner is authorized to convey by quitclaim deed any interest the State may have in and to Chase Island (Widow's Island), in Vinalhaven, in the County of Knox, to such person or persons as shall have, on the effective date of this act, deeds and conveyances of record purporting to convey to them title to said island.

Chapter 77

AN ACT Relating to Residence of Judge of Eastport Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1903, c. 219, § 1, amended. The first sentence of section 1 of chapter 219 of the private and special laws of 1903 is amended to read as follows:

'A municipal court is hereby established in and for the City of Eastport in ~~our~~ the County of Washington, which shall be denominated the Eastport Municipal Court, and shall be a court of record, with a seal, and shall consist of one judge who shall be an attorney at law and reside in the legislative district in which said Eastport municipal court is located.'

Chapter 78

AN ACT to Create a School Administrative District in Allagash Plantation.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the school committee of Allagash Plantation has filed an application with the Maine School District Commission to become a school administrative district; and

Whereas, a committee from this municipality has conducted a thorough study of the school conditions and finds there is a vital need for safe and adequate school facilities and improved educational program in the municipality; and

Whereas, it is geographically impossible to meet the minimum requirement of 300 resident high school pupils in this area; and

Whereas, the Maine School District Commission cannot approve Allagash Plantation as a school administrative district under the criteria set out in the Revised Statutes of 1954, chapter 41, section III-E; and
