- II. Determine the program necessary to translate the purpose of the school into effective action;
- III. Determine the units needed in a physical plant to implement both the purpose and program of the school;
- IV. Determine the size of the school in terms of ultimate design capacity;
- V. Determine the best site for relocation of the State School for Boys in terms of purpose, program and physical plant needs; and
- VI. Employ an architect or architects to translate into plans, specifications and cost estimates the thinking of the committee;
- VII. Determine the advisability of relocating the State School for Boys at Fort McKinley.

The committee shall report to the 100th Legislature with plans, specifications and cost estimates of construction and relocation of the State School for Boys. Such plans, specifications and cost estimates shall be complete to the extent that if the 100th Legislature or any future Legislature should appropriate the necessary funds, such school could be constructed on the basis of such plans and estimates and with plans, specifications and cost estimates of the relocation of the State School for Boys at Fort McKinley.

Sec. 3. Reallocation of unencumbered balances. Any unencumbered balance, in the School for Boys Construction Account (No. 6384), on June 30, 1959, up to the amount of \$90,000 shall not lapse but shall carry forward and is hereby reallocated to be expended for the purposes defined in this act. Any balances, in this account on June 30, 1960, shall carry forward, but all balances shall lapse on June 30, 1961.

Chapter 150

AN ACT Permitting the Building of Marinas in Lake Maranacook, Kennebec County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Building marinas in Lake Maranacook, permitted. Earl S. Norcross, his heirs, associates and assigns are authorized and empowered to construct, maintain and control removable docks, commonly known as marinas, in the waters of Lake Maranacook; in the Town of Winthrop, Kennebec County, to be used as public wharves, the same to be located on the west side of Norcross Point, so called, at the south end of Lake Maranacook.

The marinas shall not extend into the waters of Lake Maranacook more than 50 feet beyond the point where the fill and said water meet, or the low-water mark, whichever is the farthest point into the lake at the spot where the shoreward end of the marina is affixed.

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The said Norcross is authorized to construct not more than 4 marinas, all of which shall be constructed between said Norcross' southwest corner and a point on the west shore of said Norcross Point 250 feet northerly thereof.

Earl S. Norcross shall furnish a deed to the Inhabitants of the Town of Winthrop of a right-of-way from the town way designated as Bowdoin Street, along and over said Norcross Point in a general northerly direction, to the water, for the free use of the public.

The said Norcross shall also furnish to the public a parking area contiguous to said right-of-way, not less than 50 feet by 60 feet, to be used by the public, free of charge, for the parking of automobiles, boats and boat-trailers.

Said Norcross shall build and maintain a ramp from the northerly end of Norcross Point into the water of said lake, for the free use of the public, for the purpose of launching and removing from the water privately-owned water craft.

The above-mentioned right-of-way, parking area and launching ramp may be discontinued by said Norcross, his heirs, associates and assigns upon the establishment and designation of a town landing, on or near the south end of said Lake Maranacook, by the Town of Winthrop. Any such discontinuance of either the right-of-way, parking area or launching ramp by said Norcross, his heirs, associates or assigns shall operate as a revocation of the authorization herein granted to construct, maintain and control marinas on said Lake Maranacook.

Laurence H. Foster, his associates, heirs and assigns are hereby authorized and empowered to construct, maintain and control a wharf in the waters of said Lake Maranacook, the same to be located at a point within 75 feet north from the north side of the bridge across the Mill Stream, so called, on Bowdoin Street and adjacent thereto. In no case shall the wharf extend more than 18 feet into the lake from the low water mark.

Said wharf is not to be built on town land until he first obtains the approval of the voters of the Town of Winthrop at a special or annual town meeting.

Chapter 151

AN ACT Relating to Non-lapsing Funds of Present Biennium for Armory Repairs and Expansion.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the projects authorized by the 98th Legislature to repair and expand certain armories are not in process due to the fact that federal funds, although appropriated, are not yet available; and

Whereas, it is vitally necessary that the following legislation be enacted to prevent the lapsing of the various appropriations; and
