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**RESOLVES, 1959****CHAP. 9**

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## Chapter 6

**RESOLVE, in Favor of Robert H. Anderson of Falls Church, Virginia.**

**Robert H. Anderson; reimbursed. Resolved:** That there be, and is, appropriated from the funds of the State Liquor Commission the sum of \$50 to be paid to Robert H. Anderson of Falls Church, Virginia, to reimburse him for a retail malt liquor license issued for the year 1958, and which he was unable to use because the property was destroyed by fire 6 weeks later.

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## Chapter 7

**RESOLVE, Opening Muddy Pond, Wayne, Kennebec County to Ice Fishing.**

**Muddy Pond, Wayne; open to ice fishing. Resolved:** That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Muddy Pond, Town of Wayne, Kennebec County, to ice fishing under the general laws for Kennebec County from the time ice forms in the fall until March 31st.

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## Chapter 8

**RESOLVE, Closing Shin Ponds, Upper and Lower, Penobscot County, to Ice Fishing.**

**Shin Ponds, Upper and Lower; closed to ice fishing. Resolved:** That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Shin Ponds, Upper and Lower, T. 6, R. 6, T. 5, R. 7 and Mt. Chase Townships, Penobscot County, to all ice fishing.

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## Chapter 9

**RESOLVE, Regulating Ice Fishing in Hot Pond, Penobscot County.**

**Hot Pond; regulating ice fishing. Resolved:** That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a

rule and regulation opening Hot Pond, T. 6, R. 6, T. 6, R. 7, Penobscot County, to ice fishing for pickerel, white perch, hornpout, yellow perch, eels, cusk, chubs and smelts from the time the ice forms in the fall until March 31st and to ice fishing for all fish except black bass from February 1st to March 31st.

## Chapter 10

### RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Grace Pond, Somerset County.

Grace Pond; regulating fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Grace Pond in Upper Enchanted Township, Somerset County, to fishing under the general law. The use of live bait is prohibited.

## Chapter 11

### RESOLVE, Regulating Smelt Fishing in Coffee Pond, Cumberland County.

Coffee Pond; regulating fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Coffee Pond and tributaries, in Casco, Cumberland County, to the dipping of smelts.

## Chapter 12

### RESOLVE, Opening Sebago Lake, Cumberland County, to Taking Smelts.

Resolves, 1957, c. 71, repealed. Resolved: That chapter 71 of the resolves of 1957 is repealed as follows:

~~'Sebago lake; closed to taking of smelts. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Sebago lake, Cumberland County, to the taking of smelts for a period of 2 years from the effective date of this resolve.'~~
