Chapter 43

RESOLVE, Opening Sheepscot Lake, Waldo County, to Ice Fishing for Game Fish.

Ice fishing for game fish in Sheepscot Lake, regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Sheepscot Lake, in the Town of Palermo and County of Waldo, for the taking of salmon, trout, togue and other game fishes through the ice after the first day of February each year.

Effective September 12, 1959

Chapter 44

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Wyman Lake, Somerset County.

Wyman Lake; open to ice fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Wyman Lake, in the Town of Moscow, Pleasant Ridge and Caratunk Plantations, and Carrying Place T1, R3, Somerset County, to ice fishing from ice in to March 31st; and be it further

Wyman Lake; night fishing for cusk and smelts permitted. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation permitting night fishing for cusk and smelts in said Wyman Lake.

Effective September 12, 1959

Chapter 45

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Gull Pond, Franklin County.

Fishing in Gull Pond, regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to open Gull Pond, Dallas Plantation, Franklin County, to fishing under the general law and establishing a daily limit of 5 trout or salmon and prohibiting the use or possession of live fish as bait.

Effective September 12, 1959

Chapter 46

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Haley Pond, Franklin County.

Fishing in Haley Pond; regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue

a rule and regulation prohibiting the use or possession of live fish as bait in Haley Pond, Rangeley and Dallas Townships, T2, R2, Franklin County.

Effective September 12, 1959

Chapter 47

RESOLVE, Paying to the Estate of Ray E. Gordon Salary Earned by Ray E. Gordon.

Estate of Ray E. Gordon; salary earned by Ray E. Gordon. Resolved: That the Superintendent of the State School for Boys, in South Portland, be authorized to settle the claim of the Estate of Ray E. Gordon, of Gorham, in the amount of \$142.20, as a full and final settlement for the claim against the State for salary earned; and that such funds be taken from the funds in the farm account of the State School for Boys.

Chapter 48

RESOLVE, in Favor of Arthur Robbins of Gouldsboro.

Arthur Robbins; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the General Highway Fund the sum of \$500 to be paid to Arthur Robbins, of Gouldsboro, as a full and final settlement of his claim against the State for damage, not compensated by the State Highway Commission, to a well on his property caused by the construction on State Highway Project #F-044-I (3) in Gouldsboro.

Effective September 12, 1959

Chapter 49

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Narrows Pond, Kennebec County.

Fishing in Narrows Pond; regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Narrows Pond, Upper and Lower, in the Town of Winthrop, Kennebec County, to ice fishing for all fish except bass during February and March. There shall be a daily bag limit of 5 trout, salmon and togue in the aggregate which shall not exceed a weight of 7½ pounds in the aggregate.

Effective September 12, 1959
