Chapter 84

RESOLVE, Authorizing Survey and Plans for a Maine-Quebec Highway.

Survey of Maine-Quebec Highway; authorized. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$15,000 from the General Highway Fund to be expended under the direction and supervision of the State Highway Commission to obtain the necessary information to properly describe the location by metes and bounds of a way from Ashland to the Quebec border at a point near d' Aaquan, P. Q.

Effective September 12, 1959

Chapter 85

RESOLVE, Opening Long Lake, Aroostook County, to Smelt Fishing.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves do not become effective until 90 days after the Legislature adjourns unless passed as emergencies; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary to permit fishing for smelts in Long Lake, Aroostook County, as soon as the ice is out this spring; and

Whereas, the conservation of fish for both the inhabitants of Maine and our summer visitors is vital to the economy of the State; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Long Lake, Aroostook County, opened to smelt fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening tributaries of Long Lake in T. 17, R. 3; T. 17, R. 4, St. Agatha and Madawaska, Aroostook County, to fishing for smelts by dip net only.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 86

RESOLVE, Opening Portland Lake in Aroostook County to Ice Fishing for Salmon and Trout.

Portland Lake; open to ice fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be, and is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Portland Lake, situated in the Town of Bridgewater, Aroos-
