Chapter 128

RESOLVE, Providing for Decrease in Retirement Benefit for Helen D. Perry of Rockland.

Helen D. Perry; retirement benefit decreased. Resolved: That the retirement benefit now being paid to Helen D. Perry of Rockland, under the Revised Statutes, chapter 63-A, be decreased from \$1,404 per year to \$1,380 per year, to be retroactive to January 1, 1960.

Effective April 29, 1960

Chapter 129

RESOLVE, Appropriating Moneys for Spruce Budworm Control.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment; and

Whereas, a severe outbreak of spruce budworm has developed in the forests of northern Maine, threatening the destruction of one of Maine's outstanding natural resources; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary to control this outbreak so as to save 175,000 acres of Maine forest; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Spruce budworm control. Resolved: That there be, and is, appropriated \$65,625 from the General Fund to be expended by the Forest Commissioner or his agents for spruce budworm control as the state's share with the rest of the funds for control supplied by landowners and the Federal Government; and
