Chapter 82

AN ACT Relating to Leases of Facilities for State Government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 15-A, § 25, sub-§ XIX, amended. Subsection XIX of section 25 of chapter 15-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 340 of the public laws of 1957, is amended to read as follows:

'XIX. Facilities required by State. To lease or approve the leasing of grounds, buildings, facilities and office space required by departments and agencies of the State Government. No lease shall be for a period of more than 10 years.'

Effective September 16, 1961

Chapter 83

AN ACT to Clarify State Disbursements.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 15-A, § 19, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 19 of chapter 15-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 340 of the public laws of 1957, is amended to read as follows:

'Every disbursement from the treasury shall be upon the authorization of the State Controller and the Treasurer of State, as evidenced by their facsimile signatures, which authorization shall be in the form of a warrant drawn in favor of the payee, and said warrant shall, upon being countersigned by the Treasurer of State and delivered by the Treasurer of State to the payee, become a check against a designated bank or trust company acting as a depository of the State Government.'

Chapter 84

AN ACT Relating to Boundaries of Limington, Hollis and Waterboro Game Preserve.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 149, amended. The first sentence of that part of section 149 of chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, which relates to the boundaries of Limington, Hollis and Waterboro Game Preserve, is amended to read as follows:

'The following described territory situated in the Towns of Limington, Hollis and Waterboro, in York County; beginning at a point where the Little Ossipee
