Chapter 143

AN ACT Relating to Renewal Motor Vehicle Instruction Permits.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 60, amended. The 11th sentence of section 60 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 2 of chapter 214 of the public laws of 1957, is further amended to read as follows:

'A renewal permit may be issued for an additional 90 days for a fee of \$1, but no more than 3 renewal permits shall be issued to any one applicant within an 18-month period. Failure to complete the driving test within said 18-month period will require submitting to a reexamination for the permit.'

Chapter 144

AN ACT Exempting Taking of Alewives in Part of Kennebec River from Law Prohibiting Artificial Lights.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37-A, § 35, sub-§ II, additional. Section 35 of chapter 37-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 331 of the public laws of 1959, is amended by adding a new subsection II, to read as follows:

'II. Exception for Kennebec River and tributaries. This section does not apply to the taking of alewives and blue backs in the waters of the Kennebec River and its tributaries, including the Sasanoa River, northerly from a line between Squirrel Point Light in the Town of Arrowsic and the highway bridge over the outlet of Center Pond, so called, in the Town of Phippsburg, from April 1st to October 1st of each year. Nothing in this section shall be so construed as to affect in any way the established rights of any town to the alewife fishing within its corporate limits.'

Chapter 145

AN ACT Relating to Maximum Grants in Some Public Assistance Categories.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 25, § 281, amended. The last 2 sentences of the first paragraph of section 281 of chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes are amended to read as follows:

'This assistance shall be sufficient, when added to all other income and support of the recipient, to provide such person with a reasonable subsistence com-
