Sec. 5-E. Limitation. Nothing in this chapter shall be interpreted as limiting intentional exposure of patients to radiation for the purpose of diagnosis or therapy, or medical research, as authorized by law.

Sec. 5-F. Construction. This chapter shall not be construed as repealing any laws of the State relating to radiation sources, exposures, radiation protection and professional licensure, but shall be held and construed as auxiliary and supplementary thereto, except to the extent that the same are in direct conflict herewith.

Sec. 5-G. Contracts with federal agencies. The Governor is authorized to execute contracts with appropriate federal officers or agencies relating to the responsibility of radiation hazards pursuant to P. L. 86-373, Federal-State Amendment to the Atomic Energy Act of 1954.'

Chapter 404

AN ACT to Exempt Fallout Shelters from Taxation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 91-A, § 10, sub-§ VI, ¶ F, additional. Subsection VI of section 10 of chapter 91-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 399 of the public laws of 1955, and as amended, is further amended by adding a new paragraph F, to read as follows:

F. Any real property constructed, altered or improved as to include or to include a fallout shelter facility complying with the specifications of the Office of Civil Defense of the Department of Defense of the United States Government to the extent that the increase in value of real property is attributable to the fallout shelter facility; provided that no exemption shall be allowed in an amount greater than \$200 multiplied by the number of occupants which such fallout shelter facility is designed to accommodate in accordance with such specifications.'

Chapter 405

AN ACT Relating to Educational Foundation Program Allowance.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. L., 1961, c. 389, § 1-A, additional. Chapter 389 of the public laws of 1961 is amended by adding after section 1, a new section 1-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 1-A. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$1,210,971 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1963 to carry out the purposes of section 1.'

Sec. 2. Effective date. This act shall become effective on July 1, 1962.
