CHAP. 242

Chapter 241

AN ACT to Provide for the Support of Cancer Clinic Services.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the State of Maine, through the Department of Health and Welfare, supported cancer clinic services; and

Whereas, such services, although vital to the health and welfare of the people of Maine, will have to be curtailed or eliminated because of lack of funds; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary to continue such services; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation for cancer clinic. There is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund to the Department of Health and Welfare the sum of \$10,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1962 and the sum of \$15,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1963 to support cancer clinic services. The breakdown shall be as follows:

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall become effective January 1, 1962.

Effective January 1, 1962

Chapter 242

AN ACT Providing Funds to Complete the Harbor Project in the Town of Wells.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the Congress of the United States has appropriated money for the improvement of rivers and harbors, and federal funds are available for the Wells Harbor Project; and

CHAP. 244

Whereas, the completion of the harbor project is vital to the economy of the County of York and State of Maine; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

State funds. There is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$100,000 to the Town of Wells, to aid said town to complete the Wells Harbor Project, so called.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.

Effective December 2, 1961

Chapter 243

AN ACT to Authorize the Employment of Additional Personnel at the Maine Vocational Technical Institute.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. Authorization for additional personnel at the Maine Vocational Technical Institute. Authorization is granted for the employment of an instructor for a building construction course and an instructor for an automotive technology course at the Maine Vocational Technical Institute to permit the enrollment of more students for the 1962-1963 academic year.
- Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$8,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1963 to carry out the purposes of this act; the breakdown of which shall be as follows:
