CHAP. 63 RESOLVES, 1961

issue a rule and regulation that there shall be a daily bag limit of 5 trout taken from Messer Pond and Little Messer Pond in T5, R8, Penobscot County. Bowlin Pond, T5, R8, Penobscot County, shall be restricted to the use of wet or dry flies only, used in the usual manner, without bait.

#### Chapter 61

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Certain Waters in Androscoggin County.

Fishing in certain waters in Androscoggin County; regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game is authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Androscoggin Lake (Also in Kennebec County), Wayne, Leeds; Bear Pond, Big (Also in Oxford County), Turner; Berry Pond, Greene; Black Pond, Turner; Brettun's Pond, Livermore; Hooper Pond, Greene; Lard Pond, Turner; Loon Pond, Webster; Mud Pond, Turner; No Name Pond, Lewiston; Rack Pond, East Livermore; Round Pond, East Livermore; Round Pond, East Livermore; Spear Pond, Webster; Sandy Pond, Turner; Schoolhouse Pond, East Livermore; Spear Pond, Webster; Stone Mill Pond, Durham; Sutherland Pond, Webster; Taylor Pond, Auburn; The Basin, Auburn and Turner Pond, East Livermore to fishing for all fish except trout, salmon and togue from October 1st to October 31st of each year.

### Chapter 62

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Cupsuptic River, Oxford County.

Fishing in Cupsuptic River, Oxford County; regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game is authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Cupsuptic River in Oxford County to fly fishing only from April 1st to September 30th of each calendar year and establish a daily bag limit of 5 fish from April 1st to September 15th and a daily bag limit of one fish from September 16th to September 30th.

### Chapter 63

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Eagle Lake, St. Froid Lake and Long Lake, Aroostook County.

Eagle Lake, St. Froid Lake and Long Lake; fishing regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Eagle Lake, St. Froid Lake and Long

Lake, Aroostook County, in the Fish River Chain, to the use or possession of live fish, except smelts, as bait for the calendar years 1962 and 1963; to ice fishing for salmon and trout under the general law from February 1st until March 31st each year and opening said lakes to fishing under the general law.

#### Chapter 64

RESOLVE, Regulating Ice Fishing on Millimagasset Lake, Mooseleuk Lake and Big Machias Lake.

Ice fishing; regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Millimagasset Lake, T7, R8, WELS, Penobscot County; Mooseleuk Lake, T10, R9, Piscataquis County and Big Machias Lake, T12, R8, Aroostook County to ice fishing for all fish from February 1st to March 31st and prohibiting the use or possession of live fish as bait for the calendar years 1962 and 1963.

#### Chapter 65

RESOLVE, Designating Certain Bridges of the Interstate System Across the Kennebec River as "Clinton A. Clauson Memorial Bridges."

Designation of certain bridges of Interstate Highway System. Resolved: That in recognition of the outstanding and unselfish service rendered by the late Clinton A. Clauson to the State of Maine the bridges on the Interstate Highway System in Maine across the Kennebec River from Fairfield to Benton be named the "Clinton A. Clauson Memorial Bridges;" and be it further

Resolves, 1959, c. 54, amended. Resolved: That chapter 54 of the resolves of 1959 is amended to read as follows:

'Designation of Interstate Highway System. Resolved: That in recognition of the outstanding and unselfish service rendered by the late Brian M. Jewett to the State of Maine that the Interstate Highway System in Maine, except for the bridges across the Kennebec River from Fairfield to Benton, be named the "Brian M. Jewett Memorial Highway" and that appropriate plaques designating the name of the highway be erected and maintained by the State Highway Commission at such locations in rest areas as the State Highway Commission shall select.'

### Chapter 66...

RESOLVE, Regulating Ice Fishing on Portage Lake, Aroostook County.

Portage Lake; ice fishing regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Portage Lake, Aroostook County, to ice fishing for all fish from February 1st to March 31st of the calendar years 1962 and 1963.
