Chapter 69

RESOLVE, in Favor of Stanley Megquier of Orient.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment of the Legislature unless enacted as emergencies ; and

CHAP. 71**RESOLVES, 1961**

Whereas, the damages to the property, which is the subject matter of this resolve, and which were created by the construction of U. S. highway #1 should be repaired as soon as possible so that the occupant may enjoy his home in 1961; and

Whereas, the necessary repairs should be undertaken as soon as possible; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Stanley Megquier; compensated. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the General Highway Fund the sum of \$950 to be paid to Stanley Megquier, of Orient, as a full and final settlement of his claim against the State for damage, not compensated by the State Highway Commission, to his property in constructing highway U. S. #1 (Amity-Orient Project) in 1960.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 70

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Maranacook Lake, Kennebec County.

Fishing in Maranacook Lake; regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game is authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing so much of Maranacook Lake, in the Town of Winthrop, Kennebec County, as lies southerly of the railroad bridge which crosses the narrows in said lake in an east-west direction just southerly of the Winthrop-Readfield town line to ice fishing until February 1st of each year, at which time it shall be opened for all fish except bass until March 31st. There shall be a daily bag limit of 5 trout, salmon and togue in the aggregate which shall not exceed a weight of 7½ pounds in the aggregate.

Chapter 71

RESOLVE, Permitting Demolishing Certain Building at Maine State Prison.

Maine State Prison; building demolished. Resolved: That the Maine State Prison authorities may demolish so-called House No. 6 on the State Prison grounds, Town of Thomaston, Knox County.
