legal reserve life insurance, its usage and its sale, to provide through this state association for coordinating the efforts of the several life underwriters associations of this State, to promote educational and legislative measures that are conducive to the welfare of the citizens of this State and the institute of life insurance, to promote and review literary achievements in the field of life insurance, and generally to promote the welfare of its members and the prosperity of the business of life insurance and its agents in the State of Maine, and by that name shall have the power to sue and be sued, and possess all the rights and privileges of corporations under the laws of the State of Maine.

- Sec. 2. Officers and bylaws. Said corporation may elect officers as it may deem necessary, and may adopt such constitution and bylaws, rules and regulations, not inconsistent with the laws of this State, as it may deem proper for the management of its affairs, including the admissions, government and expulsion of its members.
- Sec. 3. First meeting. The first meeting of the corporation may be called by any one of the persons named in this act by mailing notice of the time and place of such meeting to each of the persons named in this act at least one week prior to such meeting.
- Sec. 4. Recording certificates; fees. Before commencing business, the corporation shall make and record a certificate of incorporation in accordance with the Revised Statutes of 1954, chapter 54, section 4, within the time limit expressed and pay the fees required by said section.

Chapter 44

AN ACT Prohibiting Anchored Boats in Earley Salmon Pool, Piscataquis County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Anchored boats in Earley Salmon Pool; prohibited. The use of anchored boats during the legal fishing season is prohibited in the Earley Salmon Pool in the Wilson River, Piscataquis County, from the head of the island to Earley's Falls.

Chapter 45

AN ACT Relating to Retirement Benefits for Members of the Lewiston Police Department and Members of the Lewiston Fire Department and Pensions for Their Beneficiaries.
