Chapter 79

AN ACT Relating to Registrar of Voters of Town of Rumford Holding Other Town Offices.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1951, c. 45, Art. XXII, § 2, amended. Section 2 of article XXII of chapter 45 of the private and special laws of 1951 is amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 2. Duplication in officers. No town official, either elected or appointed, shall hold more than one town office at a time, except that the offices of clerk ~~and~~, treasurer and registrar of voters may be held concurrently by the same person, and except as otherwise provided by Article XX, section 1, of this act.'

Chapter 80

AN ACT Relating to Purchase of Equipment and Vehicles by the City of South Portland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1933, c. 55, Art. 9, § 9, amended. The first sentence of section 9 of article 9 of chapter 55 of the private and special laws of 1933 is amended to read as follows:

'Money may be borrowed, within the limits fixed by the Constitution and statutes of the State now or hereafter applying to said South Portland, by the issue and sale of bonds or notes pledged on the credit of the city, the proceeds to be used for the payment of indebtedness of the city contracted for the acquisition of land, the construction and equipment of buildings and other permanent public improvements, the purchase of equipment and vehicles, either the first acquisition or replacement thereof, for use by the various departments of the city, and the payment or refunding of bonds, notes and certificates of indebtedness previously issued.'

Chapter 81

AN ACT Repealing Law Relating to Appointment of Members of Police Force of the City of Brewer.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1917, c. 120, repealed. Chapter 120 of the private and special laws of 1917, relating to the regulation of the appointment of the members of the police force of the City of Brewer, is repealed.
