PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

1963

December 31st of each year, the trustees shall make a detailed report of their doings, of the financial condition of said district, and also such other matters and things pertaining to said district as shall show the inhabitants thereof how the said trustees are fulfilling the duties and obligations of their trust; said report to be made and filed with the municipal officers of the Town of Phippsburg, the same to be printed in the annual town report of said town. The accounts and affairs of said district shall be audited annually by the auditors for the Town of Phippsburg.

Sec. 4. Referendum. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved, only for the purpose of permitting its submission to the legal voters of the Town of Phippsburg present and voting at a special election to be called by the selectmen of the Town of Phippsburg and held not later than 4 months after the effective date of this act.

The town clerk shall prepare the required ballots, on which he shall reduce the subject matter of this act to the following question: "Shall the Act to Incorporate the Phippsburg Cemetery District, passed by the 101st Legislature, be accepted?" The voters shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed against the words "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same.

This act shall take effect immediately upon its acceptance by a majority of the voters voting at said meeting, but only if the total number of votes cast for and against the acceptance of this act is at least 10% of the total vote for all candidates for Governor in the Town of Phippsburg at the next previous gubernatorial election.

The result of the vote shall be declared by the municipal officers of the Town of Phippsburg and a certificate thereof shall be filed by the town clerk with the Secretary of State.

Chapter 127

AN ACT Granting Full Pension Benefits to Lillian Watson of Bangor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Lillian Watson of Bangor to receive full pension benefits. When Lillian Watson, of Bangor, shall have completed 20 years of service with the City of Bangor on January 4, 1964, she shall be retired by the City of Bangor with a life pension of one-half the highest pay she received from her employment prior to July 8, 1961.
