Chapter 6

RESOLVE, Regulating Ice Fishing on Lake Wassookeag, Dexter, Penobscot County.

Ice fishing on Lake Wassookeag, regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game is authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing that part of Lake Wassookeag in Dexter, Penobscot County, lying 600 feet westerly to the Guy H. Hall Memorial Bridge on the road leading from said Dexter to Sangerville, Route #23, so called, to the southerly shore by the ski slope, thence in a northerly direction to the public picnic area, to ice fishing.

Chapter 7

RESOLVE, Opening Kingsbury Pond and Mayfield Pond to Smelt Fishing.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves do not become effective until 90 days after the Legislature adjourns unless passed as emergencies; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary to permit fishing for smelts in Kingsbury Pond, Piscataquis and Somerset Counties, and Mayfield Pond, Somerset County, as soon as the ice is out this spring; and

Whereas, the conservation of fish for both the inhabitants of Maine and our summer visitors is vital to the economy of the State; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Kingsbury Pond and Mayfield Pond; opened to smelt fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game is authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Kingsbury Pond and its tributaries to the taking of smelts in Mayfield Plt. and Kingsbury Plt., Piscataquis and Somerset Counties and also opening to the taking of smelts, Mayfield Pond and its tributaries in Mayfield Plt. and Brighton Twp., Somerset County.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 8

RESOLVE, Relating to Ice Fishing and Night Fishing on Indian Pond, Somerset and Piscataquis Counties.

Indian Pond; night fishing and ice fishing. Resolved: That the Commis-

sioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be authorized to issue a rule and regulation opening Indian Pond in Somerset County, T. 1, R. 7, T. 1, R. 6 and Piscataquis County, T. 2, R. 6 to ice fishing for pickerel, hornpout, white perch, yellow perch, eels, cusk, chubs and smelts from the time ice forms in the fall until March 31st and opening said pond to night fishing for cusk and smelts.

Chapter 9

RESOLVE, Opening St. Georges and Little St. Georges Lakes, Waldo County, to Ice Fishing.

St. Georges and Little St. Georges Lakes; open to ice fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game be authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening St. Georges Lake and Little St. Georges Lake in the Town of Liberty, Waldo County, to ice fishing.

Chapter 10

RESOLVE, Authorizing Director of Public Improvements to Convey Land in Scarborough to George W. Scamman, Robert W. Scamman and Wentworth W. Scamman.

Director of Public Improvements; authorized to convey land. Resolved: That the Director of Public Improvements, in the name of the State of Maine be, and is, authorized and directed to execute and convey by quitclaim deed to George W. Scamman, of Portland, in the County of Cumberland and State of Maine, and to Robert W. Scamman and Wentworth W. Scamman, both of Anaheim, in the County of Orange, and State of California, as tenants in common and not as joint tenants, the interest of the State in a certain lot or parcel of land situated in the Town of Scarborough, County of Cumberland, State of Maine, and bounded and described as follows:

A certain lot or parcel of land situated on Scottow Hill on the northerly and southerly side of Payne Road, in the Town of Scarborough, County of Cumberland, and State of Maine, being the Leonard Libby Homestead Farm, so called, being the same premises conveyed to Leonard Libby by Allison Harmon, Jr., by deed dated February 29, 1836, and recorded in Cumberland registry of Deeds, Book 172, Page 104.

An easement for 99 years in the above premises for the purpose of erecting and maintaining a radio tower or pole, and the maintenance thereof, was acquired by Foster B. King, officer-in-charge of the Scarborough Barracks of the Maine State Police, as shown by deed recorded in the Cumberland County
