RESOLVE, Authorizing the Maine Defense Commission to Convey Certain Land in Presque Isle.

Maine Defense Commission authorized to convey certain land. Resolved: That the Maine Defense Commission is authorized and directed to convey by quitclaim deed to the City of Presque Isle, the interest of the State in a certain piece or parcel of land on the easterly side of the U. S. Highway No. 1, so called,
