CHAP. 126 RESOLVES, 1963

Whereas, if the property is deeded back to the City of Gardiner, it will be used for a community project; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary for the research program of the Maine Sardine Council; and

Whereas, the following legislation will save rental of the property involved by the Council; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Maine Defense Commission authorized to convey certain land. Resolved: That the Adjutant General on behalf of the Maine Defense Commission is authorized and directed to convey by quitclaim deed to the City of Gardiner, the interest of the State in a certain lot or parcel of land located on the easterly side of Armory Street, so-called, in said Gardiner, and bounded and described as follows, to wit:

Beginning on the easterly side of said Armory Street at the northwest corner of other land of said grantee herein; thence in a northerly direction along said Armory Street two hundred (200) feet more or less; thence easterly at approximate right angles one hundred seventy-three (173) feet more or less to land now or formerly owned or occupied by Fritz Dessler; thence southerly at approximate right angles along the line of said Dessler two hundred (200) feet more or less to other land of the grantee herein; thence westerly along other land of grantee herein one hundred seventy-three (173) feet more or less to point of beginning.

Being the same premises conveyed to the State of Maine by the City of Gardiner by deed dated December 6, 1963 and recorded in the Kennebec County Registry of Deeds, book 1324, page 369; and be it further

Maine Sardine Council to purchase property. Resolved: That the Maine Sardine Council is authorized to purchase from James E. Flanagan of Bangor land and buildings located at 470 North Main Street, Brewer, for the sum of \$35,800. Such sum shall be expended from the funds of the Maine Sardine Council. The property will be used for the Maine Sardine Council's research and quality control activities.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 126

RESOLVE, Permitting Use of Appropriated Federal and State Funds at Maine Vocational Technical Institute.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, chapter 109 of the resolves of 1963 provides that funds to match federal funds available under Title VIII of the National

Defense Education Act be used for the electronics course at the Maine Vocational Technical Institute; and

Whereas, it is important that a portion of these funds be available to purchase equipment for the electrical technology course at the same institution; and

Whereas, the \$10,000 appropriation is to be expended during the present fiscal year, and \$15,000 during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1965; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Resolves, 1963, c. 109, amended. Resolved: Chapter 109 of the resolves of 1963 is amended to read as follows:

'Appropriating moneys to match federal funds. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$10,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1964 and the sum of \$15,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1965 for the purpose of matching federal funds made available for technical education, electronics course and electrical technology course at Maine Vocational Technical Institute, under the provisions of Title VIII of the National Defense Education Act.'

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 127

RESOLVE Authorizing the Attorney General to Convey Certain Land in Raymond to the Town of Raymond.

Attorney General Authorized. Resolved: That the Attorney General be authorized and directed to convey by quitclaim deed to the Town of Raymond the interest of the State of Maine for the sum of \$2,837.60 in a certain lot or parcel of land, with buildings thereon, in Raymond, County of Cumberland, and State of Maine, described as follows:

Land and buildings situated in Raymond, Maine, and described in deed from Bernard A. Bove to Vincent Clark, dated April 24, 1939, and recorded in Cumberland County Registry of Deeds, Book 1578, page 101; excepting therefrom that parcel conveyed by Vincent Clark to Waldo Beck on August 8, 1960, and recorded in Cumberland County Registry of Deeds, Book 2557, page 167, and that parcel conveyed by Vincent Clark to Robert C. MacAusland on June 16, 1961, and recorded in said Cumberland Registry of Deeds, Book 2611, page 154.
