Chapter 24

AN ACT Providing for Group Insurance for Civilian Technicians Employed by the Military.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 25, § 712, amended. Section 712 of Title 25 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read as follows:

'Without cost or liability to the State at any time, the Adjutant General may enter into insuring agreements with authorized insurance carriers for group life insurance or group health and accident insurance or prepayment plans for hospital and medical service or insurance for the army and air technicians employed by the military establishment as state employees and paid from federal funds.'

Chapter 25

AN ACT Relating to Licensing Dogs in Unorganized Territory.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 7, § 3453, amended. Section 3453 of Title 7 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding at the end, a new paragraph, as follows:

'Dogs kept in unorganized territories where there is no duly authorized dog recorder shall be licensed by the owner or keeper in the nearest municipality or unorganized territory having a dog recorder.'

Chapter 26

AN ACT Permitting Entrances from Liquor Premises to Owners' Living Quarters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 7, additional. Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 7 to read as follows:

‘§ 7. Entrances from premises to living quarters

The commission (Liquor) may grant written permission to a licensed person, who operates a retail store, to maintain an entrance, doorway or other aperture leading directly from the licensed premises to his living quarters.’

Chapter 27

AN ACT Relating to Regulation of Vehicles on Publicly Owned Property.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 30, § 2151, sub-§ 3, ¶ A, amended. Paragraph A of subsection 3 of section 2151 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

‘A. Regulating the operation of all vehicles in the public ways and on publicly owned property; providing the fact that a vehicle is unlawfully parked shall be prima facie evidence of the unlawful parking of such vehicle by the person in whose name such vehicle is registered.’

Chapter 28

AN ACT Relating to Open Season on Raccoons.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2358, sub-§ 4, amended. The first sentence of subsection 4 of section 2358 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

~~‘Raccoons and skunks~~ Skunks may be hunted during the period from August 15th to December 15th of each year and raccoons may be hunted during the period from September 15th to December 15th of each year.’

AN ACT Increasing Death Benefits Under State Retirement Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec 1. R. S., T. 5, § 1124, sub-§ 1, ¶ B, sub-¶ (1), div. (a) - (e), amended. Divisions (a) to (e) of subparagraph (1) of paragraph B of subsection 1 of section 1124 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes are amended to read as follows:
