\$100 per month. Such payments to any parent shall commence the first month after the death of the member occurs and continue until death or remarriage, whichever happens first. Benefits are only payable under this provision in the event no other benefits have been received in accordance with divisions (a), (b), (c) or (d).'

Sec. 2. Effective date. Said amounts provided by this Act shall become effective on the first day of the month following the effective date of this Act and proper adjustments in benefits already being paid under the Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1124, shall be made to these persons who are recipients of said benefit.

Chapter 30

AN ACT Relating to Penalty Relative to Short Lobsters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 12, § 4451, sub-§ 1, ¶ A, amended. Paragraph A of subsection 1 of section 4451 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'A. And whoever does so shall be punished by a fine of \$10 and in addition by a fine of \$5 for each such lobster involved, up to and including the first 5, and by a fine of \$25 for each such lobster in excess of 5, or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or by both.'

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 12, § 4455, sub-§ 1, ¶ A, amended. Paragraph A of subsection 1 of section 4455 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'A. Whoever possesses any such tail section of lobster meat shall be punished by a fine of ~~\$10~~ \$25 and in addition by a fine of \$5 for each such tail section of lobster meat possessed, or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or by both.'

Chapter 31

AN ACT Relating to Traffic Ordinances.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 30, § 2151, sub-§ 3, ¶ C, amended. Paragraph C of subsection 3 of section 2151 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'C. The municipal officers of towns ~~may~~ shall have exclusive power to enact all ordinances authorized by this subsection. Seven days' notice of the meet-

ing at which said ordinances are to be proposed shall be given in the manner provided for town meetings, and such ordinances shall be effective immediately. A village corporation shall have the same powers and duties as a municipality under this section.'

Chapter 32

AN ACT to Extend the Military Law to Females.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 25, § 701, repealed and replaced. Section 701 of Title 25 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

‘§ 701. Definitions

Wherever in chapters 121 to 139 the following quoted words appear, they shall have the meaning set out below:

1. **Military purposes.** “Military purposes” shall mean any purpose that will aid in facilitating the preparation for or conduct of war whether for defense or offense or whether on land, sea or in the air.

2. **Enlisted personnel.** “Enlisted man” or “enlisted men” shall mean enlisted personnel, male or female.’

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 25, § 761, amended. Section 761 of Title 25 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

‘§ 761. Composition

The militia of the State of Maine shall consist of all able-bodied male citizens of the State and all other able-bodied males who have or shall have declared their intention to become citizens of the United States, who shall be more than 18 years of age and, except as otherwise provided, not more than 45 years of age, **and such females as may be enlisted, appointed or commissioned therein.** Said militia shall be divided into these classes: the National Guard, the naval militia, other organized militia units and the unorganized militia.’

Chapter 33

AN ACT to Correct Errors and Inconsistencies in the Sea and Shore Fisheries Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 12, § 3452, sub-§ 2, ¶ A, additional. Subsection 2 of section 3452 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new paragraph A to read as follows:
