CHAP, 347

PUBLIC LAWS, 1965

- 1. Two-family dwellings. The rental of a one-family unit of a 2-family dwelling, one unit of which is occupied by the owner;
- 2. One-family dwellings. The rental of not more than 4 rooms of a one-family dwelling which is occupied by the owner.'

Effective September 3, 1965

Chapter 345

AN ACT Increasing State Tax in Unorganized Territory.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 36, § 451, amended. The first sentence of section 451 of Title 36 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'For necessary expenses of local and State Government, a tax is assessed annually at the rate of ## 15 mills on the dollar upon each municipality, township and each lot and parcel of land not included in any township in the State.'

Effective September 3, 1965

Chapter 346

AN ACT Regulating Fly Fishing in Certain Portion of Kennebec River.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2553-A, additional. Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 2553-A, to read as follows:

'§ 2553-A. Fly fishing in Kennebec River

Kennebec River, downstream from Indian Pond dam in T1 R6, Somerset County to tidewater in Augusta, Kennebec County, shall be closed to all fishing except fly fishing for all fish from September 15th to October 31st of each year with a one-fish daily limit.'

Effective September 3, 1965

Chapter 347

AN ACT Relating to Definition of Kidnapping.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 17, § 2051, amended. The first sentence of section 2051 of Title 17 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:
