CHAP. 379

PUBLIC LAWS, 1965

The municipal officers may establish such fees as are necessary to defray the costs of public notice, advertising and the expenses of hearings relating to applications for a contract, but in no case to exceed \$25 per applicant.

Any person, firm or corporation holding a permit to maintain a community antennae television system, issued prior to July 1, 1965, shall not be required to comply with this paragraph; provided, however, that any such permit holder whose system shall not be in operation on or before July 1, 1966 shall be required to comply with this paragraph and the original permit shall be null and void; provided further that cases in litigation on July 1, 1965 shall not be required to be in operation prior to July 1, 1967.'

Chapter 378

AN ACT Relating to Excise Tax on Aircraft.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., T. 36, § 1482, sub-§ 1, ¶ A, amended. Paragraph A of subsection 1 of section 1482 of Title 36 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:
 - 'A. Aircraft. For the privilege of operating aircraft within this State, each heavier and lighter than air aircraft so operated and owned or controlled by a resident of this State, or a nonresident operating for compensation or hire within this State and required to register under Title 6, shall be subject to such excise tax as follows: A sum equal to 23 13 mills on each dollar of the maker's list price for the first or current year of model, ±6½ 11 mills for the 2nd year, ±2½ 9 mills for the 3rd year, 97 mills for the 4th year, 5½ 5 mills for the 5th year and 3 mills for the 6th and succeeding years. The minimum tax shall be \$10.'

Chapter 379

AN ACT Relating to Uniforms for Full-Time Deputy Sheriffs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 30, § 951, amended. The last sentence of section 951 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'Upon approval of the county commissioners, uniforms for full-time deputies required by this section but not exceeding # for any one county shall be furnished by the county. The number of uniforms to be furnished the sheriff and all full-time deputies in each county shall be as follows: Androscoggin, 11; Aroostook, 6; Cumberland, 18; Franklin, 4; Hancock, 5; Kennebec, 8; Knox, 6; Lincoln, 3; Oxford, 12; Penobscot, 12; Piscataquis, 3; Sagadahoc, 3; Somerset, 4; Waldo, 5; Washington, 4 and York, 9.'
