§ 555. Penobscot County

The county attorney of the County of Penobscot may appoint ~~an assistant~~ **2 assistant county attorneys, one to be known as first assistant county attorney and the other to be known as second assistant county attorney**, who shall be ~~a~~ **resident residents** of the county and duly admitted to the practice of law in this State, to be approved by a Justice of the Superior Court resident in said county or by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court, and who shall hold ~~his~~ **their offices** during the term of the county attorney by whom ~~he was~~ **they were** appointed, subject to removal at any time by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court. Said ~~assistant~~ **assistants** shall take the oath prescribed for county attorney and assist the county attorney in the ordinary duties of his office, in the drawing of indictments, in the hearing of complaints before the grand jury and in the preparation and trial of criminal causes. ~~He~~ **They** shall, when directed by the county attorney, act as counsel for the State in the trial of complaints before the District Court.'

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 30, § 2, amended. The 11th paragraph of section 2 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'Penobscot County: County commissioners, \$2,500; clerk of courts, \$5,500; deputy clerk of courts, \$4,500; county attorney, \$5,500; **first assistant county attorney, \$4,250; second assistant county attorney, \$4,000;** county treasurer, \$3,500; sheriff, \$5,800; register of deeds, \$5,000; judge of probate, \$5,500; register of probate, \$4,500.'

Sec. 3. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Attorney General the sum of \$2,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1966 and the sum of \$4,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1967 to provide for the salary for a second assistant county attorney of Penobscot County. The breakdown shall be as follows:

Sec. 4. Effective date. This Act shall become effective on January 1, 1966.

Chapter 421

AN ACT Relating to Salaries of Commissioner of Agriculture and Deputy Secretary of State.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 5, § 81, amended. Section 81 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes is amended by inserting after the first sentence of the 2nd paragraph the following new sentence:

'The Secretary of State may appoint the Deputy Secretary of State subject to the Personnel Law.'

Sec. 2. Legislative intent. It is the intent of the Legislature that section 1 shall in no way affect the tenure of the office of the Deputy Secretary of State who shall receive a salary not less than the salary paid to him as of the effective date of this Act.

Sec. 3. R. S., T. 7, § 1, amended. The 3rd sentence of section 1 of Title 7 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'He (Commissioner of Agriculture) shall receive an annual salary of ~~\$11,000~~ \$12,000.'

Sec. 4. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$750 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1966 and \$1,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1967 to carry out the purposes of section 3.

Chapter 422

AN ACT to Provide for Establishment of a Veterans Memorial Cemetery.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 37, c. 2, additional. Title 37 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new chapter 2 to read as follows:

'CHAPTER 2

VETERANS MEMORIAL CEMETERY

§ 21. Land purchase

The Commissioner of Veterans Services shall acquire by purchase, gift or otherwise from the owners thereof, at such price as shall be mutually agreed upon between the commissioner and such owners, such real estate as in his judgment is suitable and necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions for a Veterans Memorial Cemetery, and obtain from such owners the title in fee simple for the same. Such real estate shall be not less than 50 acres and shall be near the center of population of the State of Maine.

§ 22. Monument; buildings, etc.

The Commissioner of Veterans Services shall purchase and cause to be erected in the center of the Veterans Memorial Cemetery, to be suited to the topography of the land, a suitable monument with suitable flag poles on which shall be displayed in accordance with the Flag Code, the National Emblem and the State of Maine flag. The immediate area surrounding this monument shall be prepared and reserved as a suitable place for Memorial Day or other patriotic or memorial observances. The remainder shall be laid out in a wheel-like pattern
