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'§ 197. Clerks; office expenses

The Attorney General is authorized to employ in his office in addition to the officers named in section 196, state criminal inspectors and additional clerks as the business of his office may demand, whose appointment and compensation shall be subject to the Personnel Law. He may incur a reasonable expense for postage, printing, stationery and other office expenses.'

Sec. 2. Legislative intent. It is the intent of the Legislature that section I shall place the present special investigators under the Personnel Law but their salary shall be not less than the salary paid to them as of the effective date of this Act plus any increases granted through legislative action at the First Special Session of the 102nd Legislature.

Chapter 479

AN ACT Relating to Refund of Fuel Tax to Companies Furnishing Common Carrier Passenger Service.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 36, § 2909, amended. The first sentence of section 2909 of Title 36 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'Any person, firm or corporation engaged in furnishing common carrier passenger service under a certificate issued by the Public Utilities Commission shall be reimbursed and repaid to the extent of 3/7 of the entire amount of such tax paid by him upon that proportion of the internal combustion engine fuel used in locally encouraged vehicles operated by him which his tax-exempt passenger fare revenue derived from such service bears to his total passenger fare revenue.'

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 36, § 3037, amended. The first sentence of section 3037 of Title 36 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'Any person, firm or corporation engaged in furnishing common carrier passenger service under a certificate issued by the Public Utilities Commission shall be reimbursed and repaid to the extent of 3/7 of the entire amount of such tax paid by him upon that proportion of the combustible gases and liquids used in an internal combustion engine used in locally encouraged vehicles operated by him which his tax-exempt passenger fare revenue derived from such service bears to his total passenger fare revenue.'
