Chapter 57

AN ACT Increasing Number of Members of Superintending School Committee of Town of Fairfield.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1945, c. 47, § 2, amended. The first sentence of section 2 of chapter 47 of the private and special laws of 1945, is amended to read as follows:

'The officers of the town who shall be nominated and elected by the qualified voters of the Town of Fairfield as hereinafter provided shall be: 5 councillors comprising a town council; 3 5 members comprising the superintending school committee, and a town clerk.'

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1945, c. 47, § 2, amended. The last sentence of section 2 of chapter 47 of the private and special laws of 1945 is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'The 3 members chosen in the manner provided for in this section shall designate by lot one member to serve 2 years and the other 2 members to serve 3 years. They shall certify such designation to the town clerk to be by him recorded. Thereafter the members shall be chosen at the annual meeting of the Town of Fairfield to hold office for 3 years. Said committee may fill vacancies occurring between annual meetings, and the term of office of any member of the committee so chosen shall expire at the next annual meeting.'

Chapter 58

AN ACT Regulating Taking of Alewives in Narraguagus River.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1959, c. 155, § 108-A, additional. Chapter 155 of the private and special laws of 1959 is amended by adding a new section 108-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 108-A. Taking of alewives in Narraguagus River. Exclusive rights to the taking of alewives from Narraguagus River in the Town of Cherryfield, Washington County, shall be optional with the town.

The town, at its annual meeting, may determine by vote whether the alewife fishing in Narraguagus River shall be operated by the town, through its selectmen or a committee appointed for that purpose or the privilege offered for sale by the said selectmen or committee; and likewise may provide for regulations, compatible with good conservation practices, to govern the times when and the manner in which alewives shall be taken therein.

Whenever such regulations are thus provided for, and upon approval by the Commissioner of Sea and Shore Fisheries, they shall be promulgated by the
