Chapter 129

AN ACT to Make Allocations from Bond Issue for Construction and Equipment of Pollution Abatement Facilities.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of the Water Improvement Commission will become due and payable prior to May 31, 1965; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Allocation. From the proceeds of the sale of bonds for construction and equipment of pollution abatement facilities—from July 1, 1964 to June 30, 1965, from July 1, 1965 to June 30, 1966 and from July 1, 1966 to June 30, 1967—shall be segregated, apportioned and expended as designated in the following schedule:

*(Any balance shall not lapse but shall be carried forward from year to year to be expended for the same purposes.)

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 130

AN ACT to Create the Bridgton Sewer District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Incorporation. The territory and the inhabitants therein, of the Town of Bridgton in the County of Cumberland, shall constitute a public sewerage district and a body politic and corporate under the name of "Bridgton Sewer District". The purpose of said district, subject to the provisions of section 10 hereof, shall be to control, operate and manage sewers in the Town of Bridgton with all appurtenances thereto, taking over sewers, if any, owned by the Town
