Chapter 140

AN ACT Relating to Ricker Classical Institute.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1847, c. 10, repealed and replaced. Chapter 10 of the private and special laws of 1847, as amended, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Corporators; corporate name; powers and privileges. Joseph Carr, Junior, Leonard Pierce, Zebulon Ingersoll, John Hodgdon, Jeremiah Trueworthy, Shepard Cary, Zenas P. Wentworth and Benjamin L. Staples, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted a corporation by the name of Ricker Classical Institute; and by this name may sue and be sued, have a common seal, make such bylaws, not repugnant to the laws of this State, as they may deem expedient for the management of its affairs, fill all vacancies occurring in their number, take and hold any estate, personal or real, that it may now possess, or may hereafter receive by donation or otherwise, the annual income of which shall be faithfully applied to promote the cause of education; and Ricker Classical Institute, aforesaid, is entrusted with all the powers and privileges incident to similar corporations. Said Ricker Classical Institute shall have the power to grant such diplomas as are customarily granted by secondary schools.'

Chapter 141

AN ACT Providing for a Council-Manager Form of Government for Town of Limestone.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Council-Manager Charter of Town of Limestone

ARTICLE I

Grant of Powers to the Town

Sec. 101. Incorporation. The inhabitants of the Town of Limestone, within the limits as now established or as hereafter established in the manner provided by law, shall be a municipal corporation by the name of the Town of Limestone, Maine.

Sec. 102. Powers of the town. The town shall have, exercise and enjoy all the rights, immunities, powers, privileges and franchises, and shall be subject to all the duties, liabilities and obligations provided for herein, or otherwise pertaining to or incumbent upon said town as a municipal corporation, or the inhabitants or municipal authorities thereof. It may enact bylaws, regulations and ordinances not inconsistent with the Constitution and laws of the State of Maine, and impose penalties for the breach thereof not exceeding \$100 in any one case, to be recovered to the use of said town by appropriate action.
