Chapter 169

AN ACT Permitting Berwick to Apply for Aid Under the Bridge Act for Construction of Eddy Bridge.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Berwick may apply for aid under the "Bridge Act." The Town of Berwick is authorized to apply for state and county aid in the reconstruction of the State of Maine portion of the Interstate Bridge between Berwick, Maine and Somersworth, New Hampshire, known as the "Eddy Bridge" and all the provisions of the "Bridge Act," so-called, Revised Statutes, Title 23, sections 353, 354, 355, 451 to 457 and 459 shall apply in the same manner as provided for intrastate bridges.

Chapter 170

AN ACT to Provide Funds for Expansion of Vending Stand Program for the Blind.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Vending Stand Program for the Blind. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Welfare (Division of Eye Care and Special Services) the sum of \$1,932 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1966 and the sum of \$2,010 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1967 for expansion of the Vending Stand Program for the Blind. The breakdown shall be as follows:

Chapter 171

AN ACT Appropriating Funds to Construct Windbreak on Bridge Between Old Town and Indian Island.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation for construction of windbreak on the Old Town-Indian Island bridge. There is appropriated from the General Highway Fund the sum of

\$3,000 for the purpose of constructing a windbreak on the state highway bridge between Old Town and Indian Island in Penobscot County.

Chapter 172

AN ACT to Provide Funds for the Continuing of Maine's Participation in the New England Pavilion at the New York World's Fair.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment of the Legislature unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 101st Legislature by chapter 77 of the private and special laws of 1963 appropriated funds for the purpose of participation of the State of Maine, in conjunction with other New England States, in the New York World's Fair, 1964-1965, and to provide for the State's share of the construction of a State of Maine Pavilion and of exhibits to be included therein; the operation and management of the New England States exhibition pavilions, grounds and facilities, and the maintenance of exhibits to be included therein; and the general business administration, supervision, accounting and insurance of the entire exhibition and all pavilions; and

Whereas, anticipated costs and unknown costs beyond the control of the management of the New England Council World's Fair Corporation have arisen during the first year of operation at the New York World's Fair and have weakened and even threatened the continued existence of the New England Pavilion of which the Maine Pavilion is a part; and

Whereas, all Governors of the New England States have been approached for additional appropriations to overcome the present emergency and have mutually agreed to request funds for the purpose from their individual legislators; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Appropriation. The sum of \$20,000 is appropriated from the Un-appropriated Surplus of the General Fund to the Executive Department for the purpose of continuing Maine's participation in the New England Pavilion at the New York World's Fair.

Sec. 2. Governor authorized and empowered to draw warrant. The Governor is authorized and empowered to draw his warrant for this sum and cause such sum to be paid over to the New England Council World's Fair Corporation, if all other New England States appropriate similar amounts and pay over to the New England World's Fair Corporation such similar amounts in single lump sum payments.
