## Chapter 177

### AN ACT to Provide Funds for Expansion of Home Teaching Programs for the Blind.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

**Expansion of home teaching programs for the blind.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Welfare (Division of Eye Care and Special Services) the sum of \$7,260 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1966 and the sum of \$7,661 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1967 for additional home teaching positions for the blind. The breakdown shall be as follows:

## Chapter 178

### AN ACT Appropriating Moneys for Maine Civil War Commission.

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts and resolves passed by the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period will not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, the commemorative activities and functions planned by the Maine Civil War Commission during this period will require funds for their accomplishment; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

**Appropriation.** There is appropriated to the Maine Civil War Commission from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$5,000 for
