Chapter 223

AN ACT to Appropriate Moneys for Legislative Expenditures.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves passed by the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, sufficient funds are not available to cover the expenses of the 102nd Legislature while in session; and

Whereas, funds now available for legislative expenditures are nearly exhausted, it is, therefore, necessary to provide additional funds for the operating costs of the current special session; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriations for legislative expenditures. In order to provide for the necessary legislative expenditures for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1966, the following sums or as much thereof as shall severally be found necessary, as designated in the following tabulation, are appropriated out of any moneys in the General Fund not otherwise appropriated. The breakdown shall be as follows:

Any balance of this appropriation shall not lapse but shall be carried forward from year to year to be expended for the same purposes.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 224

AN ACT to Increase the Indebtedness of the Town of Poland School District.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the present buildings which house the schools of the Town of Poland are overcrowded, inadequate and unsafe; and

Whereas, it is imperative that action be taken at the earliest possible moment to relieve these conditions; and

Whereas, new building construction is vitally necessary; and

Whereas, the present borrowing capacity of said town will not allow it to borrow sufficient funds for the necessary construction and equipment; and

Whereas, it is very desirable that this matter be acted upon by the voters of said town at the earliest possible date; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1953, c. 109, § 4, amended. The first paragraph of section 4 of chapter 109 of the private and special laws of 1953, as amended by chapter 168 of the private and special laws of 1961, is further amended to read as follows:

'To procure funds for the purpose of this Act and for such other expenses as may be necessary to carry out said purposes, the said district, by its trustees, is hereby authorized from time to time to borrow such sums of money as shall be fixed at an annual meeting of the Town of Poland or a special meeting thereof called and held for that purpose, and to issue its bonds and notes therefor, but shall not incur a total indebtedness exceeding the sum of ~~\$175,000~~ \$285,000.'

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 225

AN ACT to Extend the Maine Civil War Centennial Commission.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the powers of the Maine Civil War Centennial Commission expired on December 31, 1965 by virtue of section 2 of chapter 48 of the private and special laws of 1959; and

Whereas, the purposes of the commission have not been fully reached in that projects planned have not been completed; and

Whereas, it is fitting and proper that the brave deeds of Maine's Civil War heroes and veterans should have full and proper recognition during this the 100th observance of the Civil War; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
