Chapter 252

AN ACT Appropriating Funds for the Completion of the Zoology Building at the University of Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the University of Maine the sum of \$150,000 to complete the construction of the Zoology Building authorized by section B of chapter 161 of the private and special laws of 1965.

Chapter 253

AN ACT to Implement the State Technical Services Act.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

University of Maine; appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the University of Maine the sum of \$25,000 to provide for the implementation of the State Technical Services Act (P. L. 89-182). Any unexpended balance shall not lapse but shall remain a continuing carrying account until the purposes of this Act have been accomplished.

AN ACT Appropriating Funds for Eye Care and Special Services Division,

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment of the Legislature unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, in order to aid more efficiently and fuller certain segments of our population, funds are requested for the Division of Eye Care and Special Services, Department of Health and Welfare; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Eye Care and Special Services Division, Department of Health and Welfare, the sum of \$35,200. The breakdown of expenditures shall be as follows:

Chapter 255

AN ACT Appropriating Moneys for Relocation and Conversion of Dispensary at Maine Maritime Academy.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment of the Legislature unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the present dispensary at Maine Maritime Academy is in Dismukes Hall to be renovated in 1966; and

Whereas, original plans contemplated removal of the dispensary to Leavitt Hall, to be renovated in 1967; and

Whereas, since funds are not available to renovate Dismukes Hall and Leavitt Hall at the same time, it is desirable to house the dispensary in a cottage; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary to convert the cottage for use as a dispensary and will permit creation of needed student dormitory rooms in Leavitt Hall; and
