Chapter 264

AN ACT Appropriating Money for the Education of Indian Children.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Department of Education, education of Indian children; appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$36,467 to the Department of Education, Education of Children in the Unorganized Territory to carry out the purposes of this Act according to the following expenditure schedule:

Chapter 265

AN ACT Appropriating Money to Match Federal Funds Provided Under Title III of the National Defense Education Act and Under the Vocational Education Act of 1963.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Department of Education, National Defense Education Act; appropriation. In order to provide funds necessary to match federal funds allotted to the State of Maine for administration and supervision of additional instructional programs authorized under provisions of Title III of the National Defense Education Act as amended by the 88th Congress, there is appropriated out of the General Fund the sum of \$25,000. The breakdown of expenditure shall be as follows:

All Other	\$25,000

It is the intent of the Legislature that the appropriations provided by this section be transferred, by means of contributions and transfers, to the Special Revenue Fund, National Defense Education Act, Title III, Instruction, and from there, upon the receipt of allotments approved by the Governor and Council on the basis of work programs submitted to the State Budget Officer, the State Controller shall authorize expenditures on a matching basis of these appropriations and of the federal funds accruing thereto on the basis of such allotments and not otherwise.

It is further the intent of the Legislature that the Department of Education be authorized to establish on a permanent basis the 5 program supervision and related clerical positions heretofore authorized by the Governor and Council
