Effective September 3, 1965

Chapter 57

RESOLVE, in Favor of Francis J. Boudreau, Jr., of Carmel for Damage by Highway Construction and to Reimburse Delmont R. Hawkes, of Standish, for Well Damage.

Francis J. Boudreau, Jr.; compensated. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the General Highway Fund the sum of \$500 to compensate Francis J. Boudreau, Jr., of Carmel for damages to his well, plumbing, fixtures and health by the addition of harmful salt content; and be it further

Delmont R. Hawkes; reimbursed. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the General Highway Fund the sum of \$500 to be paid to Delmont R. Hawkes, of Standish, for damage to his well caused by highway construction on Route 114.

Chapter 58

RESOLVE, Providing Increases in Retirement Allowances for Certain Retired Fish and Game Wardens.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves do not become effective until 90 days after the Legislature adjourns unless passed as emergencies; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary to provide increases in the allowances received by certain retired fish and game wardens of advanced years to meet their minimum requirements; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Certain fish and game wardens; retirement allowances increased. Resolved: That the Maine State Retirement System shall increase the retirement allowances of the following retired fish and game wardens to an amount which will grant to each of such persons a retirement allowance of \$100 per month until such time as Legislative Document 1509 shall become effective. At such time the Department of Inland Fisheries and Game shall finance the difference between the retirement provided by Legislative Document 1509 and \$100 per month as provided by this resolve:
