§ 105. Executive director

The Governor shall appoint a person nominated by the executive board to be executive ~~secretary~~ director for a term of 4 years and fix his salary.

Chapter 3

AN ACT Relating to Permits to Operate Heavy Motor Vehicles in Unorganized Territory.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 29, § 1703, amended. The last paragraph of section 1703 of Title 29 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

The State Highway Commission, in respect to state and state aid highways and bridges within city or compact village limits, and municipal officers in respect to all other ways and bridges within such city and compact village limits and the county commissioners in respect to county roads and bridges located in unorganized territory in said county, may grant permits to operate vehicles having a gross weight exceeding the limit of gross weight prescribed in this Title, and all such permits may contain any special conditions or provisions which in the opinion of the grantors are necessary.

Chapter 4

AN ACT Relating to the Issuance of Temporary Boat Numbers.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the Acts of Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, many thousands of boats will be sold or exchanged during the spring and early summer of 1967; and

Whereas, the boat buying public, both residents and nonresidents, would be greatly inconvenienced by the quick registration and legal operation of their boats on the waters of this State; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 38, § 234, sub-§ 8, ¶ E, additional. Subsection 8 of section 234 of Title 38 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new paragraph E, to read as follows:
