# One Hundred and Third Legislature 1967

- 4. Amsden Brook below the starch factory dam (Fort Fairfield)—Class <del>D</del>B-I.
- II. Goodrich Brook (also known as Colony Brook), Fort Fairfield, below the dam at the starch factory—Class D B-I.
- 14. Limestone Stream, from the Route 165 Bridge in Limestone Village to the Canadian border—Class D C.
- rg. Machias River, Ashland, from a point immediately above the starch factory outfall to its junction with the Aroostook River—Class  $\rightarrow$  B-1.
- 22. Pattee Brook, Fort Fairfield, from dam at starch factory to confluence with Aroostook River—Class D B-1.
- 24. Presque Isle Stream, from its confluence with the Aroostook River to the Bangor and Aroostook Railroad Bridge nearest Chapman and High Streets in Presque Isle—Class D C.

### Chapter 20

AN ACT Relating to Bureau of Corrections of the Department of Mental Health and Corrections.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 34, c. 62, additional. Title 34 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new chapter 62, to read as follows:

#### CHAPTER 62

### BUREAU OF CORRECTIONS

§ 525. Establishment; purposes

The Bureau of Corrections, as heretofore established within the department, shall be responsible for the direction and general administrative supervision of the correctional programs within the Maine State Prison, the Reformatories for Men and Women and the Juvenile Training Centers.

### § 526. Directors; duties

The commissioner shall appoint, subject to the Personnel Law, a Director of Corrections who shall be a person with training, experience, administrative and organizational ability in criminal corrections and correctional administration. It shall be the duty of the director to carry out the purposes of the bureau. In the event of vacancy in both the office of the commissioner and the office of the Director of Mental Health, or during the absence or disability of both of said officials, the director shall perform such duties and have the same powers as provided by law for the commissioner.
