Chapter 24

AN ACT Relating to Valuation Appeals in Unorganized Territory.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 36, § 381, amended. The 4th sentence of section 381 of Title 36 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

Such appeal shall be entered ~~not less than 30 days~~ **within 6 months** after such statement of assessed valuation shall have been so deposited, and notice thereon shall be ordered by said court.

Chapter 25

AN ACT Relating to Registration of Motor Vehicles by Blind Veterans.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 29, § 251, amended. The first paragraph of section 251 of Title 29 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

On application to the Secretary of State for registration of any motor vehicle of any amputee **or blind** veteran who has been the recipient of an automobile from the United States Government under authority of P. L. 663, 79th Congress, as amended, or P. L. 187, 82nd Congress, as amended, or of any amputee **or blind** veteran receiving compensation from the Veterans Administration for service connected disability who shall have a specially designed motor vehicle, such veteran shall be entitled to have said automobile duly registered and a registration certificate delivered to him without the requirement of the payment of any fee.

Chapter 26

AN ACT Relating to Retirement Allowances of Persons Who Become Legislative Employees or Legislators.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment of the Legislature unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, many employees of the Legislature, as members of the State Retirement System were restored to service and discovered that their retirement allowances were discontinued; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary to prevent undue hardship and discrimination for some Maine citizens; and
