Chapter 105

AN ACT to Limit Fishing Lobster Traps on Trawls in Certain Waters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 4465, amended. Section 4465 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended to read as follows:

§ 4465. —Certain tidal waters

It is unlawful to have on any trawl more than 3 lobster traps on one warp and buoy in that part of the tidal waters of the State ~~easterly from a line running true south from Pemaquid Point Light, Lincoln County, to a line true south from Owl's Head Light, Knox County~~ which is between the following 2 lines:

1. First line. Beginning at a point 48 miles true north of the lighthouse on Pemaquid Point, County of Lincoln and State of Maine; thence running true south through said lighthouse to a point where said line intersects the southeasterly boundary of the coastal waters within the jurisdiction of the State of Maine.

2. Second line. Beginning at a point 40 miles true north from the lighthouse at Robinson's Point, Isle au Haut, Knox County, Maine; thence running true south through said lighthouse to a point where said line intersects the southeasterly boundary of the coastal waters within the jurisdiction of the State of Maine.

Chapter 106

AN ACT Relating to Liens and Certificate to be Filed with Register of Deeds.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 10, § 3261, amended. Section 3261 of Title 10 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

§ 3261. Certificate to be filed with register of deeds

When any complaint provided for in chapters 601 to 631 in which a lien is claimed on real estate is filed with the clerk, he shall forthwith, **upon written request of the plaintiff's attorney**, file a certificate, setting forth the names of the parties, the date of the complaint and of the filing thereof, and a description of the said real estate as described in said complaint, in the registry of deeds for the county or district in which the land is situated.
