Chapter 164

AN ACT Relating to Inventory of Ballots Furnished Polling Places.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 21, § 926, sub-§ 2, amended. Subsection 2 of section 926 of Title 21 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding at the end the following:

The total number of used ballots, unused ballots, spoiled ballots, defective ballots and absentee ballots shall equal the number of ballots furnished by the Secretary of State to the municipal clerk, less the number of absentee ballots issued to voters and not returned.

Chapter 165

AN ACT to Regulate Boating on Little Nesowadnehunk (Sourdnahunk) Lake, Piscataquis County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 38, § 243, additional. Title 38 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 243, to read as follows:

§ 243. Nesowadnehunk (Sourdnahunk) Lake

No person shall operate any boat or canoe, propelled by motor on Little Nesowadnehunk (Sourdnahunk) Lake, in T. 5, R. 11, Piscataquis County.

Chapter 166

AN ACT Relating to Biennial Elections of Penobscot Tribe of Indians.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 22, § 4792, amended. Section 4792 of Title 22 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

§ 4792. Biennial elections

Biennially, on the even-numbered years, on the ~~first~~ ^{first} and Tuesday of September, the Penobscot Indians shall hold their election for the choice of governor and lieutenant governor of said tribe, and a representative at the Legislature of this State, and a tribal ~~committee~~ ^{council} to consist of 12 members of said tribe, each of whom must be at least 21 years of age. The governor shall preside over all meetings of the ~~committee~~ ^{council} and be a member ex officio. In the absence
