Chapter 281

AN ACT Permitting Municipalities to Raise Money for Blood Service Programs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 30 § 5105, sub-§ 3-A, additional. Section 5105 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new subsection 3-A, to read as follows.

3-A. Blood service. Supporting a blood service program.

Chapter 282

AN ACT Relating to Payments of Accounts and Claims Against a County or Municipality.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 30, § 704, additional. Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 704, as follows:

§ 704. Payments out of treasury

The treasurer of any county shall not pay out any funds for an account or claim against the county unless such account or claim is itemized, and such account or claim is declared to be a public record. Any violation of this section shall be punishable by a fine of not more than \$300 or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 30, § 5054, additional. Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 5054, as follows:

§ 5054. Payment out of treasury

The treasurer of any municipality shall not pay out any funds for an account or claim against the municipality unless such account or claim is itemized, and such account or claim is declared to be a public record. Any violation of this section shall be punishable by a fine of not more than \$300 or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both.
