Chapter 293

AN ACT Relating to Certain Disqualifications of Benefits Under Employment Security Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 26, § 1193, sub-§ 5, amended. The last sentence of subsection 5 of section 1193 of Title 26 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 18 of chapter 381 of the public laws of 1965, is further amended to read as follows:

If such remuneration under paragraphs A and C is less than the benefits which would otherwise be due under this chapter, he shall be entitled to receive for such week, if otherwise eligible, benefits reduced by the amount of such remuneration, provided that any fraction of a dollar included in the weekly remuneration received shall be disregarded; except that, with respect to pension payments, no claimant will be disqualified from receiving benefits, nor will benefits be reduced, because of such payments if his benefits are based entirely on wages earned from employment other than that from which he retired;

Chapter 294

AN ACT Excluding Real Estate Brokers and Salesmen from Employment Security Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., T. 26, § 1043, sub-§ 11, ¶ F, sub-¶ (19), amended. Subparagraph (19) of paragraph F of subsection 11 of section 1043 of Title 26 of the Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows:
 - (10) Service performed by an individual for a person as a real estate broker, real estate salesman, an insurance agent or as an insurance solicitor, if all such service performed by such individual for such person is performed for remuneration solely by way of commission; and
